





Installing the *Think* Test Generator from a zipped file

- 1 Download the zipped folder to your computer, then extract the content. To do so, you may need to download a decompression tool. A new folder named after the ZIP file will be created.
- 2 Open the folder and double click on the corresponding file.



3 The Test Generator will open in the browser, and you can start using it.






Using the Think Test Generator

The *Think* Test Generator makes it easy to create different types of tests at different levels. The Unit and Extension tests can be fully customised to meet the teacher's needs.

1 Click on the **Unit and Extension tests** button.



2 Select the Unit(s) and tests you want to include.

- **3** Choose **Ready-made** for PDF tests, or **Select the questions** for tests that you can customise and download as Word documents. Audio files will be automatically included alongside the Skills tests.
- **4** If you choose **Ready-made**, your test will be downloaded immediately as PDFs in a zip file.
- **5** If you choose **Select the questions**, you can then choose between **Manual** and **Auto** ways to create your test:




Manual

When you choose **Manual**, you can view all sub-questions within each question and choose which you want to include.

Auto

Choose the number of sub-questions you want to include for each question, and the *Think* Test Generator will automatically choose them for you. In the example below, you can choose up to 8 sub-questions for each question, but you won't see which ones the Test Generator has chosen until you generate the test.







6 Give your test a name and select **Generate**. The *Think* Test Generator will create two versions of your test, A and B. It will re-order the sections in the B version of the test (i.e. the Grammar, Vocabulary and Functions sections appear in a different order).

7 The *Think* Test Generator will download a zipped file containing your test as Word documents, both with and without answers. Save these to your computer, extract the files, and your tests will be ready to use.
